### **Detect and Fix Plumbing Leaks Early**

A dripping faucet and running toilet are easy-to-detect leaks that can waste dozens of gallons of

water each week. You can easily see or hear the evidence of these leaks, and you'll want to get them fixed quickly to save money and water. In addition, you'll also be

saving yourself from the annoying dripping and running sounds those leaks produce.

Hidden leaks also make an impact on your water bill. However, the greater cost of hidden leaks may be in the damage you see to walls, floors, and furnishings. For example, if pipes behind your walls begin to leak, they'll moisten the drywall – which will eventually need to be replaced.

The build-up of moisture from a leak can result in a breeding ground for mold. Removing the mold will come with another price tag, often an expensive one.

You can test for leaks with these quick and simple steps from the EPA:

 Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when

no water is being used. If it changes at all, you probably have a leak somewhere.

- Place a drop of food coloring in a toilet tank. If any color shows up in the bowl after 10 minutes, you have a leak.
- Examine faucet gaskets and pipe fittings for water on the outside of pipes.

Or you could get more serious about your faucet upgrade and move to widespread, three-hole faucets with separate handles for hot and cold water control.

Another example: the standard toilet is white, less than 17 inches in height, with a round front. Consider upgrading to an elongated toilet, which is extending the front by an inch and a half. Or a comfort height toilet which is a little taller in height. The height of these models can be 17 to 19 inches. Plus, you have a lot more color options with an upgrade than just the standard white.

You can also bring new enjoyment to your bathing rituals with other small improvements. For example, upgrade your shower head to a model that delivers a variety of sprays. Or, add a hand shower attachment that will give you the flexibility to massage aching muscles.

It seems that there's always a recall of one food product or another that sends us scurrying to check our cabinets and fridges. Plus, it's estimated that one in six will get food poisoning each year, including from food you prepare at home with or without a recall.

There are four main steps to keeping your food safe:

### Make Your Own Gel Pack

Aches, pains and swelling from springtime injuries often call for "cold treatment." To make your own gel packs, you'll need sealable plastic bags, a freezer, and other common

household items. For example, you can pour dish soap into a sealable plastic bag, double bag, then place in your freezer for a few hours. Or fill the bag with two cups of water and one cup of rubbing alcohol before placing in the freezer. Corn syrup is another option for homemade gel packs.

- Clean Make sure hands, surfaces and utensils are properly cleaned before and after food preparation.
- Separate Don't reuse cutting boards, plates and utensils for different meats, poultry or eggs. If meat juices drip onto other foods, it can cause contamination.
- Cook Don't depend on guesswork or texture. Use a food thermometer to tell you if your meat has been cooked to a safe temperature for eating.
- Chill Refrigerate perishable foods within two hours. Also, thaw frozen foods in the refrigerator rather than on the counter, where germs can spread.

If you do get sick, symptoms may include upset stomach, abdominal cramps, nausea and vomiting, diarrhea, fever and dehydration. Remember, it could take several hours to notice the effects of food poisoning. But be sure to see a doctor if your symptoms are severe. Visit foodsafety.gov for other helpful tips.

## **Spring Strawberry Salad**



When it's time for a quick, healthy meal on a beautiful spring day, salads are just the trick. Strawberry salad can serve as an entrée when you add chicken, or as a side dish when you want something light.

For the entrée version, start by cutting two boneless, skinless chicken breasts into cubes. Cook in a skillet over medium heat with two tablespoons of olive oil and two tablespoons of balsamic vinaigrette.

Cook about 10 minutes, until chicken is brown. Place chicken in a bowl and let cool.

In a salad bowl, combine a fresh bunch of spinach (rinsed and dried) with a pint of sliced strawberries, four ounces of crumbled goat cheese and a five-ounce package of candied pecans. Drizzle with another two tablespoons of olive oil and two tablespoons of balsamic vinaigrette. Add the chicken. Serve slightly warm or chilled.
